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Museum pass

New hotel

Budapest: Billed as the city’s first musical-themed hotel, Aria Hotel Budapest opens March 15 near St. Stephen’s Basilica. The 49 rooms, spa, restaurant and lounges showcase opera, jazz, classical and contemporary music. Rates start at \$219, including free breakfast, afternoon wine and cheese, and Wi-Fi. www.ariahotelbudapest.com.

Trekking

Peru: An alternative to the Inca Trail, Journeys International’s six-day, lodge-to-lodge trek takes hikers past glacier-covered Salkantay mountain, into semitropical valleys and through Llactapata Pass, with a view of Machu Picchu seen by few travelers. It’s part of an 11-day, small-group tour (from \$4,425). www.journeysinternational.com.

Ecotourism

Fiji: The Upper Navua Gorge is safe from logging and gravel extraction thanks in part to Rivers Fiji, which helped turn the 10½-mile scenic river canyon into a conservation area. It offers one-day whitewater rafting trips (\$230) and other ecofriendly river and sea kayak excursions. www.riversfiji.com.

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
