Travelers will explore Italy primarily by sea during the nine-day tour, which includes private charter flights to both Naples and Pompeii.

Cruisers will swim in the blue water of secluded coves and visit islands and towns along the way.

(The price is \$14,424 a person if six people travel instead of two.)

Ultimate New Zealand + Hawaii, Frontiers International Travel, \$83,000

The journey encompasses 44 days of active adventure: whitewater rafting, fly-fishing, hiking and sailing.

Guests will fly by helicopter to remote locations and explore caves lined with glowworms.

Sure, the trip features wine-tastings and comfy digs, too.

Guided Tour of Congo, Tanzania, Extraordinary Journeys, \$26,000

Led by a private guide, travelers will explore Congo's Virunga National Park, home to a large concentration of the world's remaining mountain gorillas.

After four full days in the 3,000-square-mile park, visitors will cross to the Serengeti, in search of Africa's "Big 5": elephant, leopard, lion, rhino and cape buffalo.
