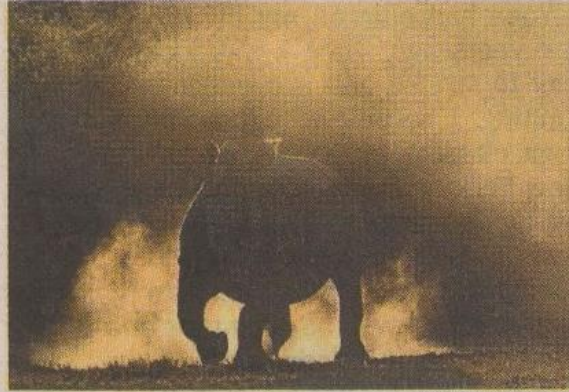

SAFARI

A Trip That Helps the Rhinos

Extraordinary Journeys, the New York City-based safari outfitter, recently announced a 10-day safari to Botswana and Zambia that is intended to benefit the Great Plains Foundation's Zeros for Rhinos plan.

Rhinos are regularly poached in South Africa and Zimbabwe and are in danger of becoming extinct, but the nonprofit has a plan to relocate 100 of them to the safety of the Okavango Delta. Half the cost of the trip — \$6,000 — is donated to the cause.

The itinerary includes a stay at three different camps, including the luxurious Zарафа Camp; prime game viewing at the 320,000-acre Selinda Reserve in northern Botswana, home to the African wild painted dog; and river excursions in dugout canoes called mokoros.

Prices begin at \$12,000 per person without international flights, and travel is valid from Nov. 1, 2014, to May 31, 2015.
