OPEN HOUSE: TOP VIEWS FROM A LIGHTHOUSE TOWER



Bring your sneakers and climb to the top of the 1898 Newburyport Harbor Light at Plum Island Point during one of several open houses coming up. The still-operational lighthouse opens to the

public for tours from 1-4 p.m., weather permitting, on July 6 and 27, Aug. 17, Sept. 7 and 28, and Oct. 12. You must be at least 5 years old and 42 inches tall to climb the short ladder to the viewing deck, with its views stretching from Cape Ann to the south to Maine's Mount Agamenticus to the north. Tours and parking are free, but donations are welcome to support the Friends of Plum Island Light, a nonprofit organization that preserves and protects this piece of North Shore history. 978-973-6935, newenglandlighthouses.net/plum-island.html

RIDING HIGH IN HELSINKI ON A NEW FERRIS WHEEL

Swoop up to 130 feet above the ground on Finland's new observation wheel and you can see from the islands of the Helsinki Archipelago to Uspenski Cathedral, the central railway station, and other landmarks on the city skyline. The **Finnair SkyWheel** (pictured below) opened this month in Katajanokka Harbour in central Helsinki, not far from where the country's national airline, Finnair, first based its flight operations in the 1920s. The wheel's 30 climate-controlled gondolas run year-round, each holding up to four people. Or choose the VIP cabin, which has a glass floor, leather seats for the four passengers, and Veuve Clicquot champagne service. A standard cabin ride is 15 minutes, a VIP cabin ride about 25. bookings to those looking for discounted lodging worldwide. The app lets you search, view, and book hotel reservations posted by sellers. Narrow your search based on your preferences, from top-rated popular hotel to independent boutique. Each listing includes images, maps, and reviews of the hotel. Once you book, Roomer transfers the reservation to your name and sends confirmation. MINI CAMERA CAN CREATE AN IMAGE JOURNAL

Capture your vacation in a series of snippets with the Narrative Clip, a miniature camera that clips onto your clothing or shoulder bag, and takes a still shot every 30 seconds throughout your day. The 5-megapixel camera, which measures 1.4 x 1.4 inches, has a built-in GPS that captures information on where each photo was taken, and an accelerometer that ensures each image is correctly oriented, whether you wear the camera in landscape or portrait mode. Double tap the camera to take a single shot outside of the set interval time. The internal battery lasts up to two days before needing to be charged through the micro USB port. Download the Android or Apple app to view and organize photos using your smartphone or tablet. \$229, includes a 3-month subscription for cloud storage (or store images on your computer). www.getnarrative.com
