Helsinki Airport Introduces GoSleep Nap Pods

Finland's airport is the latest to introduce compact, futuristic nap pods.

Napping on an airport bench? So last decade. The winter travelers who are finding themselves stranded inside East Coast airports could only wish they were flying through Helsinki, which not only keeps planes

taking off on time during heavy snowfalls, but also debuted GoSleep, which provides a personal bubble for transiting passengers. The ergonomic seats convert into a bed, complete with a shutter to block out passersby, combining simplicity with a need for privacy—exactly what you need while killing time in a hectic airport.

Currently there are 19 GoSleep pods, and pillows and blankets are available upon request. The pods cost €9 per hour—a bargain compared to all the money you'd waste while trying to stay awake.

Helsinki isn't the only place with such mini rooms. These airports around the world boast adorable little nap pods, and Haneda has an upgraded version of Tokyo's efficient capsule hotels. It's something to think about, American airports....
