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Historic site

Alabama: The 54-mile Selma to Montgomery National Historic Trail along Highway 80 traces the route of the 1965 voting rights march, as currently seen in “Selma.” Key stops include interpretive centers in Selma and Lowndes and the Edmund Pettus Bridge (pictured), where the Rev. Martin Luther King

Jr. led a symbolic second march after the first was attacked by state troopers; the third made it to the state Capitol in Montgomery. www.nps.gov/semo.

New Zealand: The annual Tremains Art Deco Weekend in Napier celebrates the city’s distinctive style with vintage car parades, train rides, fashion shows, concerts and thousands of revelers in period clothing Feb. 18-22. Year-round walking tours also explore the Art Deco city center, built just two years after a 1931 earthquake leveled the original structures.
