New Zealand: Cadbury World, a chocolate factory and gallery in Dunedin, tempts with daily tours from 10 to 75 minutes long (\$4-\$16). But the candy maker pulls all the chocs out for the annual Cadbury Chocolate Carnival, July 11-17, with tastings, body painting, facials, train rides and the Cadbury Jaffa Race, in which 25,000 coated sweets roll down the world's reputedly steepest street.
