A Meal Fit for a Prince! Inside Harry's Intimate New Zealand Lunch

Prince Harry knows how to travel in style.

On Monday, the 30-year-old royal stayed at the [Riverrun Lodge](#) in Lake Wanaka, New Zealand, as part of his royal tour of the country. The prince and his party enjoyed a private lunch and an overnight stay at the property.

For his meal, Chef Katen Marinkovic served Harry a meal of Cardrona merino lamb, Aoraki salmon and Blue River sheep's cheese quiche, accompanied by roasted spiced vegetables and quinoa salads, followed by a layered apple and walnut cake and dark chocolate date and ginger slices for desert.

The prince and his party were also served Mt. Difficulty Roaring Meg pinot noir and a Felton Road pinot noir, which is fitting as the lodge sits on the western edge of the Central Otago wine region of New Zealand.

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Of course, the lodge also offers things to do other than eat, although Harry may have opted to just focus on getting some rest during his ongoing tour.

“As Wanaka is very laid-back, it was the perfect destination,” owner Meg Taylor said in a statement. “There were lots of ideas for activities discussed, from mountain biking to fly fishing, lake fishing, jet boating and helicopter flights, but we were also advised that Prince Harry might be happy to just relax.”

The five-room lodge, which is located in the heart of New Zealand’s Southern Alps, was founded in 1997 by Meg and John Taylor.

In addition to being a working sheep farm, the lodge offers luxury accommodations, including verandas with lounges and open fire pits.

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Harry’s stay at Riverrun Lodge was short – after spending the night on Monday, he and his party moved on to continue his tour of the island nation.
