- **Down Under Answers**, for example, has a 22-day tour of New Zealand that starts in Christchurch and includes visits to Queenstown, Auckland and Stewart Island in the country's far south. Prices begin at \$8,825/person. Departure dates are available throughout the year.
- More than twice as long is the 47-day **Great Silk Road Adventure** from [Wild Frontiers](#); the trip takes a major branch of the Silk Road from Beijing to Istanbul. About \$13,300/person is all inclusive except flights.
- Mix a land trip with a cruise on the 23-Day **Alaska and Canadian Rockies Tour** from [John Hall's Alaska](#). During the 16-day land portion, travelers take in the Canadian Rockies from a luxury motorbus and tour Denali National Park in Alaska. Then there's a seven-day Royal Caribbean cruise where they can see the majestic Hubbard Glacier. Prices start at \$8,100/person.

- Europe is in the mix, too. On [Zicasso's](#) private three-week **Adventure and Romance Tour of Italy and Greece**, travelers take a moonlit gondola ride in Venice, explore the seaside terraced villages of Cinque Terre and relax on the beaches in Santorini. From \$6,600/person inclusive of some meals.

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
